



Dr. Michael K. Eklund, D.D.S., M.S., P.A. Biography

Dr. Michael K. Eklund hails from Amarillo, Texas, where he attended Texas Tech University as an undergraduate. He graduated with honors from the University of Texas Dental Branch at Houston, where he received the doctor of dental surgery (D.D.S.) degree in 1971. Dr. Eklund received his master of science (M.S.) degree from the University of Texas Health Science Center in 1975.

Dr. Eklund completed his postgraduate residency training in oral and maxillofacial surgery at the Texas Medical Center in Houston, and completed a three month rotation at HMS North Wales Hospital. Dr. Eklund is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Dr. Eklund has been in private practice in Houston since 1975. In addition to his full scope private practice, Dr. Eklund has a special interest in dental implants, wisdom tooth removal, dentoalveolar surgery, and intravenous (IV) sedation. Throughout his 34-year career, Dr. Eklund has placed thousands of dental implants and removed over 100,000 wisdom teeth.

Dr. Eklund is active in many scientific, medical, and charitable organizations. In addition to his numerous professional honors, Dr. Eklund is a highly respected speaker who is often asked to lecture on the latest advances in dental implants.
